

the Owyhee region of SE Oregon since her husband Mike Quigley introduced her to this remarkable landscape in 1993. Twenty years later she became actively engaged with conservation efforts to protect the region with the publication of her book entitled, "The Owyhee River Journals," developing a program rich in visuals that would show her audience what we stood to lose if we do nothing. She's personally reached over 4000 people through 99 presentations given throughout six states and garnered 1200 signatures in support of Owyhee wilderness status during Oregon Natural Desert Association's Owyhee Wilderness Campaign, and shows no signs of giving up!

Pat is a bird guide and ecology educator and our new hike leader for the Eugene area. Meet at 10:00 am in the Cottage Grove Walmart parking lot then carpool or caravan to the Bryce Creek trailhead south of Cottage Grove. Hike along the beautiful creek in older forests 5.7 miles one way and up to 10 miles round trip on a trail. The hike can be only 8 miles by turning around early. Hike time could be about 4 hours on rolling and some flat terrain.


Bring: rain gear, water, lunch, good hiking boots or shoes
